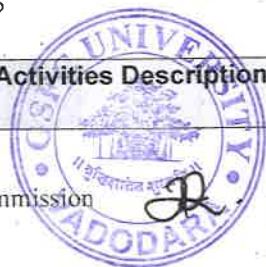

During every Academic Year, Admission Process, Students Orientation and Foundation Course is being designed and finalized. 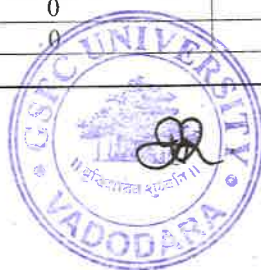

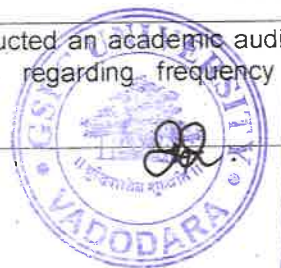
